Narrow Escape. A deal slipped from a bunch in the stings by which they were being hoisted on board the S.S. Lyverack at the Snowball mill wharf last Thursday. In its descent it grazed Mr. Patrick Foley's face, who was working below. Had it struck him fairly it would, in all probability, have killed him.

Upper S. W. Miramichi. Messrs. Timothy Lynch and M. Welch returned early last week from the scene of their lumbering operations on the Southwest Miramichi. Both gentlemen report but little snow in the woods as yet and upon the whole conditions are favorable to the lumbering.

The Last Transatlantic Vessel to leave the Miramichi was the S.S. Lyverack, 2000 tons, which was cleared by the J. B. Snowball Company, weighed anchor yesterday morning and proceeded down river under the direction of pilot Jas. Nowlan. She was accompanied by the tug S. Andrew and went over the bar in the afternoon.
