RAFTING IMPROVED WOOD.

German experts say that wood which has been floated in rafts, or otherwise, gives a more trustworthy material for joinery and building purposes than does that which has been cut or otherwise chosen directly to the sawmill and workshop. The reason is that while the wood is lying in the water its sap and albuminous and resinous matter are dissolved out. If these substances remain in the wood they readily absorb moisture from the atmosphere, after coming out of the drying rooms and the wood swells. Artificial processes of washing out the hygroscopic substances from wood which has not been floated are practised in Germany.
