In the upper part of the factory barely escaped with their lives. Mr. and Mrs. Ginnong lived on the second floor of the factory building, which was elegantly fitted up as a dwelling. They saved only the clothing they wore, a seal and a few other articles which they could take up as they made their escape. Some of the girls who had been at work on the upper floor were rescued with difficulty, as a number of them fainted through fright and made the rescuers' work the more difficult, but all were saved. The fire threatened the St. Stephen Bank building, the Windsor Hotel and the fire engine house, but, fortunately, these were saved, although ignited once or twice. The main factory building was largely consumed before the fire was overcome. The loss is put at about \$75,000, which was fairly covered by insurance. This is the third time Messrs. Ginnong have suffered by fire. They hope to be in working order again in a fortnight and in a position to produce about 75 per cent. of their output before the fire.

found several letters from "A. B. Sheraton," of Dalhousie, advising him to go west and to keep clear of the authorities. The letters did not make it clear why Chiverton should fear arrest. Detective Carpenter, when he heard of these facts, secured the Chiverton letters and came to the conclusion that they were in the handwriting of Postmaster Johnston, of Dalhousie, and that the signature "A. B. Sheraton" was a fictitious one. He further learned that there was no such person as "A. B. Sheraton" at Dalhousie. Chiverton was closely questioned, and it is alleged made a confession that it was he who robbed the Dalhousie post office. In his confession he is alleged to have declared that he was put up to the crime by postmaster Johnston, with whom he divided the money.

On the strength of this confession, Sergeant Chamberlain was sent back to Dalhousie and arrested Mr. Johnson on Saturday 7th. The prisoner at that time, Mr. W. A. Mott to defend him, and a request was made for bail, as the case was not to be tried until the 17th. Sergeant Chamberlain opposed the granting of bail, but in view of the high standing of the prisoner the magistrate decided to grant it in \$2,000, as stated in last week's ADVANCE and this was immediately furnished.

When Detective Carpenter learned that Mr. Johnson was at liberty he decided to make a second arrest on the more serious charge of having sent the box of poisoned candy to Chiverton with the intention of getting rid of him. Information was at once sent out and Mr. Johnson was placed in jail again.

It is understood that the address on the package was in a boyish or well disguised hand. It is believed that there will be difficulty in connecting Mr. Johnson with it, and it may not even be possible to clearly establish that the package was mailed in New Brunswick.

Johnson is about 30 years of age, and has a wife, a former Moncton lady, and two children. He is a son of Mr. H. A. Johnson the former postmaster, of Dalhousie, who was once a contractor in Chatham, and also in business here, in partnership with the late John Forthingham. Removing to Dalhousie Mr. Johnson became postmaster, telegraph operator, express agent and secretary of the municipality of Westigoche. He subsequently resigned all these offices and removed to Montreal, where he is said to be now residing.

Ottawa, March 15.—Chiverton, who had received the poisoned candy when working in the mining region near Riv. Portage, and who is charged with being implicated in the Dalhousie post office robbery of August last, spent last night at the Dominion police headquarters in the eastern departmental block. He was brought here by the police and was taken to Dalhousie to-day, where a charge has been laid against him.

A Dalhousie despatch of 15th says:—R. J. Chamberlain of the Dominion police arrived here this morning from Ottawa, where he was handed over. Geo. Chiverton, arrested at Riv. Portage, charged with an attempt at murder by poisoning. He is supposed to be implicated in the Dalhousie post office robbery and is to be the principal witness against postmaster Johnston. Chiverton is a native of Miramichi and has resided with his parents here during late years. He left for the west last fall with the harvesters. When about here is a quiet fellow but when drinking he will stoop to anything. Chiverton and Johnson are in jail awaiting preliminary investigation.

Chiverton is a son of Benjamin Chiverton who once lived here, but has, for a good many years resided in Dalhousie. His uncle, whose name asked the prisoner is, is a well known and respected resident of the Baibouge settlement.

LATEST:
At the preliminary hearing of the case against postmaster Johnston for stealing from the post-office, which took place at Dalhousie on Tuesday, Chiverton gave testimony showing that Johnston had, last summer, suggested the robbery to him, showing him how to get into the post office and how to steal the money. Chiverton admitted that he was misled by Johnston and that he had no knowledge of the robbery until after the fact. Chiverton gave evidence to the effect that the money had been stolen from the post office on August 11th, and that Johnston kept for a few days, at the end of which he and Johnston divided the amount equally between them. Letters from Johnston to Chiverton and a confession of the crime in Johnston's handwriting were put in evidence.

Johnson admitted all, called no witnesses and was committed for trial which is to take place on 24th inst.

In regard to the charge against Johnston of sending poisoned candy through the mails, application was made for a remand until the 23rd as the Crown witnesses from Northern Ontario have not arrived, which was granted.

The Dalhousie East Office Cases.
A good deal of interest is manifested on the North Shore, and especially in Westigoche, in the developments which have taken place within the last fortnight in connection with the robbery of \$700 from the Dalhousie post office in August last and a subsequent attempt on the part of Mr. J. A. Johnston, the postmaster, to bring about the death of the man who is said to have confessed that he was the robber.

George Chiverton, a former resident of Dalhousie, and alleged to have been one of the "tough" class when there, has been for some months in Ontario. He gave some candy to a number of his compatriots the other day, eating some of the same himself. It turned out that it was poisoned. Chiverton and the others were made very sick, but medical aid promptly given saved them all. Chiverton was subsequently arrested for giving the poison to his chums. He was searched and on his person was
