After the Mass and before the Absolution, which latter was also given by His Lordship, Bishop Barry, a splendid and eloquent tribute of praise of the late deceased P. Baile was delivered by the Rev. Wm. Morrissey, the text of which is as follows:—"Whether we live, we live to the Lord; or whether we die, we die to the Lord. Therefore, whether we live, or whether we die, we are the Lord's."

The most praiseworthy deeds in the life of the dead Bishop must be left to his future biographer to relate. The present occasion admits not even passing reference to these. The most beautiful traits of his character are not even hidden from the world in the privacy and sacredness of home life, and are revealed only by accident.
