Obituary.

The death of Mrs. Allan Ritchie, who has been for some time in Montreal for medical treatment, took place on Monday afternoon. A telegram was received by Hon. Mr. Ritchie on Monday indicating a crisis in Mrs. Ritchie's ailment and he left by the Maritime express on Monday night. Mrs. Ritchie, who was the second daughter of the late Richard Hooker, of Chatham, was widely known and highly esteemed in the community, whose sympathy goes out to the bereaved husband and family. The funeral will take place tomorrow, Friday. The hour has with Mr. Saml. Frieze's family and press. The interment will be at St. Paul's churchyard, Chatham.

Rev. T. G. Johnston, the senior minister of the Miramichi presbytery, who was so well known and universally beloved by all who knew him, died very suddenly at Doaktown last Monday night. He had taken tea with Mr. Saml. Frieze's family and appeared to be in his usual good health. He went from Mr. Frieze's to Mr. Harvie Doak's and retired in due course. During the night Mrs. Doak heard Mr. Johnston coming down stairs from his room, and on opening the door to ascertain if he could be of any assistance, he told her he felt very ill and feared he might die alone in his room, so he had made his way down stairs. He was ministered to, in the hope that he would get better, but in half an hour he was dead. The news came as a shock to all his friends. Mr. Johnston was a widower, his wife having died about six weeks since. Having no family, he bequeathed all his property, save \$200—said to be about \$6,000 in cash—to the church.

Manufactured Noses. There was exhibited last week in the "Main Room" of the Belmont Hotel, Portland, to the members of the North American Fish and Game Protective Association, a few of a lot of eighty six "noses" of seals which were manufactured by Indians with the object of getting the bounty of \$1 each offered for seal noses by the State of Maine. The noses had been made by cutting out pieces of seal skin, sewing bristles in for whiskers, and then slitting openings for nostrils. The bristles are sewn in and a knot at the end holds them from falling out, but a sharp pull draws them through the hole, and then it is seen that they never grow there. The Indians who presented this particular lot were arrested. It has been discovered that the state has been defrauded out of several thousand dollars. For years the authorities have been accepting fake noses, and as most of them have been destroyed they cannot make any arrests for them. In Portland alone \$2,642 was paid in seal bounties last year, and of this amount one man received \$1,100.

The Maine authorities were told by a New Brunswick present that such "injunty" could not be exercised in his province, for in cases in which bounties were offered for killing lynx, the skin with the nose intact had to be brought to the officer, who himself cut it off and destroyed it, giving the applicant a certificate on which he drew the bounty. The Maine officers admitted New Brunswick was ahead of them in this respect.

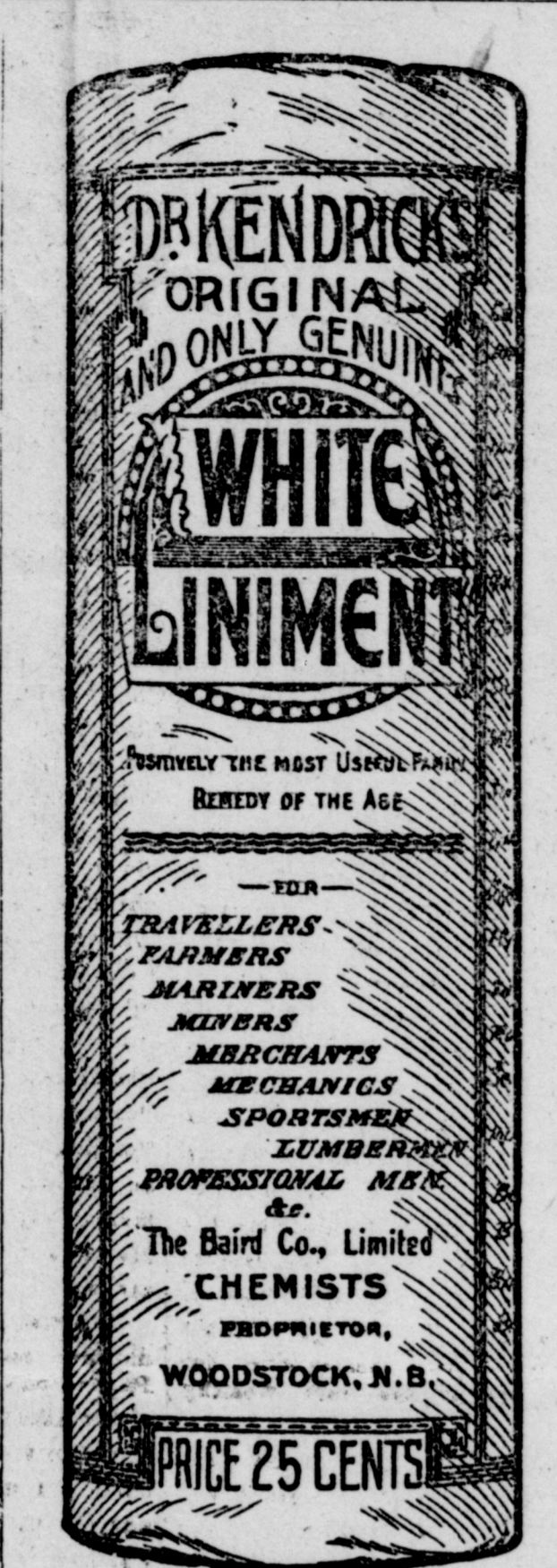
