fer he becomes gradually and thoroughly accustomed to what is required of him. The whole living machine accommodates itself to the regular demands upon it; the body becomes active and well-conditioned, without undue strain, and the muscles and tendons gradually develop.

The question is often asked: "Why does the stable horse require constant grooming, whilst the same horse turned out in a field does very well without it?" It is not the fact of living under cover but the active work and the feeding of the stable horse which necessitates grooming.

It is the work and the food, not the shelter which maintains the difference between the domesticated animal and the horse in the state of nature. By work, and especially by fast work, the secretions of the glands of the skin are largely increased. Nature must be assisted by artificial means to remove these increased secretions, or the pores of the skin will become clogged and the health will be deteriorated greatly.

The company organized for the purpose of tending on the Bay Chaleur service have had to abandon the project this season as they were unable to procure a suitable boat in time. The committee here did everything in their power to buy a suitable boat and failing in this, tried to time-charter but without success.

It is understood that Mr. Connolly, in accordance with the expressed feeling of the entire Bay Chaleur, has signified his intention of putting a first class boat on the route this season with the terminus at Campbellton if he secures the contract.
