Unusual Weather. Winter truly "lingers in the lap of Spring" this year. Steamers and other craft were plying on the Miramichi on the 14th of April—a week ago—last season, while westerly gales and snow are now still venturing on the ice.

While it was quite clear and the temperature was above the freezing point on Saturday on the Miramichi, Saturday night was decidedly cold. In one place a few miles from Chatham the thermometer fell to 15°.

There was an April snow storm of more or less severity in Nova Scotia, Southern New Brunswick and the New England Coast on Saturday. An inch of snow fell in St. John. At Toronto on Friday there was what the press despatches call a snow-bizzard, which interfered with street railway traffic.

Koryomaru reached the mouth of Port Arthur at midnight of the 12th and started the laying of mines at several points outside of the port, defying the enemy's search-lights. The second destroyer flotilla discovered at dawn of the 13th one Russian destroyer trying to enter the harbor and after ten minutes' attack sunk her.

There was no time to reconnoiter the enemy's drawing crews, as the Bayan approached. The third fleet reached outside of Port Arthur at 8 a. m., when the Bayan came out and opened fire. Immediately afterward the Novik, Askold, Diana, Petropavlovsk, Pobeda and Poltava came out and made an offensive attack.

While the enemy was trying to regain the port, a battleship of the Petropavlovsk class struck mines laid by the previous evening and sank at 10.32 a. m. Although another ship was observed to have lost freedom of movement, the confusion of the enemy's ships prevented us from identifying her. They finally managed to regain the port.

Our third fleet suffered no damage and the enemy's damage besides above mentioned, was probably slight. Our first fleet did not reach firing distance. Our first fleet retired at 1.00 p. m., prepared for another attack. They recalled April 14 toward Port Arthur. The second, the fourth and the fifth destroyer flotillas and the ninth torpedo flotilla also joined at 3 a. m. and 7 a. m. No enemy's ship was found outside the port. Our first fleet arrived at the port at 9 a. m., and discovered three mines laid by the enemy and destroyed all. The Kasuga and Nahu were despatched to the west of Lio Tsiang and made indirect bombardment for two hours. It being their first attack. The new force on Lio Tsiang were finally silenced. Our forces retired at 1.30 p. m.

The Kasuga and the Nahu were purchased from Argentina. Tokyo, April 17, 5 a. m.—The Japanese are elated over the successes they have won at Port Arthur. They are also proud of the achievements of Vice-Admiral Togo, particularly of his newest strategy of counter-mining the enemy's harbor and deceiving him as to the number of mines to an equally dangerous flank attack.

The success of the system of placing double counter-mines is due largely to a series of careful observations made by the Japanese during their previous attacks on Port Arthur. The Japanese saw the Russian fleet leave the harbor and return to it several times and they discovered that the Russian warships followed an identical course every time they came out or went in, evidently for the purpose of avoiding their own mines.

The Japanese took bearings on this course. When the torpedo divisions of the Japanese destroyer flotilla laid the counter-mines during the night of April 12-13 they placed them along this course. The laying of these counter-mines was exceedingly perilous, because if any Japanese boat with mines on board had been struck by a lucky Russian shot she would have been annihilated.

The weather of the night of April 12-13 favored the work. There was a heavy rain, the night was dark and cloudy and the Russian searchlights playing over the channel failed to reveal the Japanese destroyers. MAKAROFF WAS DEVOYED TO DESTRUCTION. R. V. Admiral Dewa was in command of the Japanese squadron which decoyed the Russian ships over the field of mines. His squadron consisted of the cruisers Chitza, Yoshino, Kasagi, and Takaage, all unarmored vessels, which presented a tempting bait for the heavier Russian ships.

Vice-Admiral Togo directed the flank attack. He had the battleships Hatanaka, Makasa, Asahi, Shikishima, Yamama and Fujii. He waited thirty miles out at sea until Rear Admiral Dewa signalled him by wireless telegraphy to come in. His vessels then dashed at full speed toward the entrance of the harbor. All the battle ships under Vice-Admiral Togo are capable of a speed of eighteen knots and they quickly covered this distance. It is not clear what warned the Russians that they had been trapped, but they probably discerned the battleship squadrons on the horizon and retreated precipitately to the harbor.

Vice-Admiral Togo did not attempt to prevent the Russians from entering but did force the destruction of the Petropavlovsk and the disabling of the Pobeda. After these occurrences the Russian ships did not leave the harbor. The highest angled guns in the fleet, capable of throwing shells to the elevated Russian landworks, which are beyond attainment by the average naval weapon.

Expressions of regret at the death of Vice-Admiral Makaroff are general here. The Koruy Vira, which participated in the latest attack on Port Arthur, is a torpedo boat which was under the command of Commander Ota. It is an expert and the success of the Japanese sea-mining operations was due largely to his ingenuity and bravery.

The Japanese report that the wreck of the Petropavlovsk lies southeast of Golden Mile one mile outside the entrance to the harbor.
