With regard to the alleged depres sion there never has been such good times in the lumber business as during the past two years. The proper time to increase the

stumpage is when the lumberman have made money. I doubt whether there is any such fall in lumber as the leader of the opposition has indicated. Purchasers armerely holding off to see what the rate of freight will be.
