THE RIOT IN COUNTY CLARE

The following is the version of the Clare riots which took place a week from Thursday last, as given by the correspondents who view the question from the Landlords standpoint.

There was a serious riot at Bodyke, County Clare, on Thursday. Accounts from Ennis state that Lieut. John O'Callaghan accompanied by 80 police and the bailiff, went to the village of Bodyke to serve writs on some of Colonel O'Callaghan's tenants.

Later reports about this affray state that a farmer named Maloney has died from the effects of a blow from the butt end of a gun.

On Thursday a force of over 1,000 soldiers and police had to protect a bailiff who attempted to serve 60 processes for rent on the estate of Capt. Maxwell Fox, near Tullamore.

men were arrested, but they had no arms. The tenant of Fort Anberg was one of the party, and his son and a servant. The others arrested were brought up at the petty sessions and re-manded.

The following is a detailed account of the affray: It appears that eighty policemen proceeded to Bodyke for the purpose of assisting in the eviction of a tenant. Bodyke is a small village situated mid-way between Scariff and Tulla, where some military are at present garrisoned.

All officers on leave of absence, whose regiments are now quartered in Ireland, have been ordered to return at once. It is expected that further arrests will be made of members of the Executive Committee of the Land League.
