RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE GUIDANCE OF COMPETITORS.

1st.—No person shall be allowed to compete unless he become a member and pays in his subscription five shillings or upwards on or before Saturday the 22nd day September, and in no case will a member be allowed to offer as his own the property of another. 2nd.—All Stock, Grain, Manufactures, &c., must be grown, raised, or manufactured, in the County, and must be entered with the Secretary previous to the day of exhibition, who will furnish each competitor with a Numbered card, corresponding with the entry in his book, which must be permanently attached to the articles exhibited, and the premiums will be awarded to the respective numbers. 3rd.—Cattle pens and other arrangements suitable for the safe keeping of stock, &c., will be arranged on the ground, previous to the time of exhibition; and halters or ropes must be furnished by the owners of horses and neat stock, that they may be tied securely; a committee will be present to arrange their position, as well as other articles for competition, wherein they must remain until the close of the exhibition; Stock must be on the ground by nine o'clock, a.m. 4th.—No animal that has taken the first premium at any of the former exhibitions of this Society, shall be allowed to compete again in the same character. 5th.—Persons competing for premiums on the largest quantity and best quality of grain and other crops raised upon a given quantity of land, must produce not less than one bushel at the exhibition, and an affidavit made by the competitor and another respectable person that such statement is correct, and the Sample exhibited a fair one, and like proof as to the quantity must be furnished the Secretary of the Society as soon after the Show as practicable. —On Vegetables, not later than the first Tuesday in December, and on Grain, not later than the second Tuesday in March next, at which time the Judges of Grain Crops will meet to determine the successful competitors. 6th.—Written statements will be required from successful competitors for Grain and Root Crops, as to the mode of preparing the Lands, time and quantity of Seed sown, and subsequent management of the same, with any other information in reference to the subject that may prove useful to the Public. 7th.—Competent and Impartial Judges will be appointed who will commence their Examination at HALF-PAST TEN o'clock, and their decision will be final. 8th.—The Judges shall be at liberty to withhold any Premium, if they consider the animal, or article offered deficient in merit. 9th.—Special Premiums will be awarded upon any Manufactures, or implements of Husbandry not specified in the above list, should such be offered, which in the opinion of the Judges are worthy of encouragement. 10th.—Hay will be furnished by the Society for all Stock offered for a Premium or Exhibition which are owned by Members residing at such a distance as to render it inconvenient to drive in the same morning of the Show.
