THE Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury having been pleased to amend their warrant of the 8th ultimo, and to issue another warrant, dated the 3rd instant fixing the postage of letters transmitted direct by British Packets between the United Kingdom and any part of British North America: the public is hereby notified that henceforth letters from the United Kingdom to New Brunswick, and vice versa, will be chargeable with an uniform rate of One Shilling sterling, when not exceeding half an ounce; a Letter weighing above half an ounce and not exceeding an ounce, will be liable to two rates of postage, and so on, according to the scale at present in operation. The payment of the postage will be optional with the sender.
