10 0 3rd .-- Cattle pens and other arrangements suitable for the safe 7 6 keeping of stock, &c., will be arranged on the ground, previous to 5 0 the time of exhibition; and halters or ropes must be furnished by 12 6 the owners of horses and neat stock, that they may be tied se-10 0 curely; a committee will be present to arrange their position, as 7 6 well as other articles for competition, wherein they must remain 6 until the close of the exhibition; Stock must be on the ground by

7 6 again in the same character.
