say it is supposed to be a disease, for it is at best but a mere supposition, as no such disease does exist. It is properly speaking a peculiar condition of the mouth, which AERICA every colt is not only subject to, but really must have, just while the second growth of the front teeth is taking place, and before they become sufficiently long to project beyond the gum and roof of the mouth, particularly that part which is just behind the row of cutting or nipping teeth. While the mouth is in this state it is of course difficult for the colt to bite off the grass in a poor pasture easily enough to keep in good condition, and consequently he loses flesh; and if in addition to this, he is made to work, (as many are at this age) without any better feed than a short pasture affords he dwindles away to a mere skeleton, and his owner thinks it is because he has the Lampers, and he treats the animal accordingly.
