RULES FOR THE GUIDANCE OF COMPETITORS.

No person shall be allowed to compete unless he becomes member and pays in his Subscription of five shillings or upwards on or before Saturday the 12th October, and in no case will a 6 member be allowed to offer as his own, the property of another. All Stock entered for Competition must have been raised in the Province, (Stallions, Bulls, Boars and Rams) excepted, and owned 0 by the exhibitor not less than three months prior to the day of exhibition.

All Grain, Root Crops and Manufactures, entered for Competi-0 tion, must be the production of this County the present year. All articles for exhibition must be entered with the Secretary not later than the Saturday next previous to the day of exhibition, who will furnish each Competitor with a numbered card correspon-0 ding with the entry in his Book, which must be attached to the 6 article exhibited, and the premiums will be awarded to the respective numbers.

No animal that has taken a premium at any previous Show of 6 this Society will be allowed to compete again in the same character Persons Competing for Root Crops grown upon a given quantity 6 of land, must exhibit a sample of two bushels at the Show, and an affidavit made by himself and another respectable person to the quantity, must also be furnished the Secretary on that day, or as 0 soon thereafter as the quantity can be ascertained.

Cattle Pens and other arrangements suitable for the purpose will be prepared previous to the day of exhibition, and halters or ropes Roller Ends and Socket Castors, 1 1-8 to 1 1-2 inch ; 3 must be furnished by the owners of Horses and Neat Stock, that they may be securely tied; a Committee will be present to assign 0 their respective positions, as well as other articles for Competition, wherein they must be placed by the parties in charge, and remain until the close of the exhibition. Stock must be on the ground by nine o'clock, A, M.

The Judges will be at liberty to withhold any premium, if they consider the Animal or article offered deficient in merit.


