5th.—Written Statements will be required from the successful Competitor as to the mode of cultivating, time of sowing, and quantity of seed sown.

6th.—Competent and impartial Judges will be appointed, who will commence their examination at half past ten o'clock, A. M., and their decision will be final.

7th.—The Judges will be instructed not to award a Premium, where they consider the animal or article deficient in merit.

8th.—Special Premiums will be awarded on articles not included in the above List, should the Judges deem them worthy of encouragement.

9th.—No animal or article that has been exhibited at any Cattle Show in the present year, will be allowed to compete, and no animal that has taken a Premium at any former Show, will be allowed to compete again in the same character.

RULES FOR THE GUIDANCE OF COMPETITORS.

No person shall be allowed to compete unless he becomes a member and pays in his Subscription of five shillings or upwards on or before Saturday the 12th October, and in no case will a member be allowed to offer as his own, the property of another.

All Stock entered for Competition must have been raised in the Province, (Stallions, Bulls, Boars and Rams) excepted, and owned by the exhibitor not less than three months prior to the day of exhibition.

All Grain, Root Crops and Manufactures, entered for Competition, must be the production of this County the present year.

All articles for exhibition must be entered with the Secretary not later than the Saturday next previous to the day of exhibition, who will furnish each Competitor with a numbered card corresponding with the entry in his Book, which must be attached to the article exhibited, and the premiums will be awarded to the respective numbers.

No animal that has taken a premium at any previous Show of this Society will be allowed to compete again in the same character.

Persons Competing for Root Crops grown upon a given quantity of land, must exhibit a sample of two bushels at the Show, and affidavit made by himself and another respectable person to the quantity, must also be furnished the Secretary on that day, or soon thereafter as the quantity can be ascertained.

Cattle Pens and other arrangements suitable for the purpose will be prepared previous to the day of exhibition, and halters or ropes must be furnished by the owners of Horses and Neat Stock, that they may be securely tied; a Committee will be present to assign their respective positions, as well as other articles for Competition, wherein they must be placed by the parties in charge, and remain until the close of the exhibition. Stock must be on the ground by nine o'clock, A. M.

Competent and impartial Judges will be selected, who will commence their examination at 10 1/2 o'clock, and their decision will be final.

The Judges will be at liberty to withhold any premium, if they consider the Animal or article offered deficient in merit.

Special Premiums will be awarded upon any Manufacture or Implements of Husbandry not specified in the above list, if such should be offered, which, in the opinion of the Judges, are worthy of encouragement.

Hay will be furnished by the Society for Stock exhibited for Premiums, and owned by members residing at such a distance as to render it inconvenient to drive in the same on the morning of the Show.

Further regulations for the government of the Show on the day of exhibition, as the Law provides, will be published in due time.
