UNDER the new Scheme of the Royal Mail Steam Packet Company, it is arranged that the Vessels of that Company shall no longer touch at Bermuda, either on the outward or the homeward voyages. Letters and Newspapers not so addressed, will be forwarded in the regular Mails by the Contract Packets proceeding from Boston to Liverpool, via Halifax.

Letters from the United Kingdom, directed to be forwarded through the United States, will be liable to a postage of 1s 2d. Sterling the half ounce, and Newspapers will be liable to an United States transit rate of One Penny Currency. The postage upon letters may be paid in advance, or not, at the option of the sender; but upon Newspapers the postage will be paid on delivery, whether in the United Kingdom or in New Brunswick.

Until further notice, the MAILS to meet the sailing of the British Contract Packets from New-York will therefore be closed at this Office every other Wednesday evening at six o'clock, commencing with this evening.

RULES FOR THE GUIDANCE OF COMPETITORS.

No person shall be allowed to compete unless he becomes a member and pays in his Subscription of five shillings or upwards on or before Saturday the 12th October, and in no case will a member be allowed to offer as his own, the property of another. All Stock entered for Competition must have been raised in the Province, (Stallions, Bulls, Boars and Rams) excepted, and owned by the exhibitor not less than three months prior to the day of exhibition.

All Grain, Root Crops and Manufactures, entered for Competition, must be the production of this County the present year.

All articles for exhibition must be entered with the Secretary not later than the Saturday next previous to the day of exhibition, who will furnish each Competitor with a numbered card corresponding with the entry in his Book, which must be attached to the article exhibited, and the premiums will be awarded to the respective numbers.

No animal that has taken a premium at any previous Show of this Society will be allowed to compete again in the same character. Persons Competing for Root Crops grown upon a given quantity of land, must exhibit a sample of two bushels at the Show, and an affidavit made by himself and another respectable person to the quantity, must also be furnished the Secretary on that day, or as soon thereafter as the quantity can be ascertained.

Cattle Pens and other arrangements suitable for the purpose will be prepared previous to the day of exhibition, and halters or ropes must be furnished by the owners of Horses and Neat Stock, that they may be securely tied; a Committee will be present to assign their respective positions, as well as other articles for Competition, wherein they must be placed by the parties in charge, and remain until the close of the exhibition. Stock must be on the ground by nine o'clock, A. M.

Competent and impartial Judges will be selected, who will commence their examination at 10 1-2 o'clock, and their decision will be final.

The Judges will be at liberty to withhold any premium, if they consider the Animal or article offered deficient in merit.

Special Premiums will be awarded upon any Manufacture or Implements of Husbandry not specified in the above list, if such should be offered, which, in the opinion of the Judges, are worthy of encouragement.

Hay will be furnished by the Society for Stock exhibited for Premiums, and owned by members residing at such a distance as to render it inconvenient to drive in the same on the morning of the Show.

Further regulations for the government of the Show on the day of exhibition, as the Law provides, will be published in due time.
