St. John.—June 1, 5 P. M.—By the Admiral arrived at 2 P. M., Boston papers of yesterday morning have been received.

The new steamship Eastern City when preparing for her trial trip at New York on Saturday afternoon, burst one of her boilers, instantly killing Captain Stearns, Charles Gounan, engineer, John B. Curtis, acting engineer, John Beers and Chas. Hall, firemen. Several others are badly scalded, but may possibly recover. The boat is not much injured.

Thomas F. Meagher, the Irish Patriot who made his escape from banishment, has arrived in New York, and been received with much enthusiasm by his fellow countrymen.

The steamship Atlantic sailed from N. York on Saturday for Liverpool with 148 passengers, among whom were Otto Goldschmidt and Lady Jenny Lind.

A WOMAN AND TWO CHILDREN BURNED.

We learn by the Bath Times that about one o'clock, Wednesday morning, fire was discovered issuing from a house on Oak Grove st., in Bath, occupied by two families, Richard Gibbs and Mr. Manes, and before the engines had arrived the lower part of the house was nearly consumed, and two boys of Mr. Gibbs, aged 5 and 7 years, who occupied the chamber over it in company with their grandmother, were burned to death! The old lady, whose name is Hurley, who, we understand, is about 65 years of age, had been awakened, and was heard to scream, and it is probable had gone down stairs to ascertain the cause of the smoke, and finding her egress cut off by the fire at the foot of the stairs, endeavored to return, but was overpowered. Her half consumed corpse was found in a position which leads to the above supposition. The bodies of the children have also been recovered.—Portland Argus.

UNRIVALLED SPEED.—They are making time on the Hudson River Railroad now, that beats the speed of any of the English railways. The 6 o'clock train out of New York Saturday morning, made the distance in three hours and one minute. The following is the running time: From 31st street, New York, to Peekskill 50 minutes; to Fishkill, 23 minutes; to Poughkeepsie, 20 minutes; to Hudson, 32 minutes; to Albany, 36 minutes; total, 181 minutes.—This is equal to about 50 miles an hour. The occasion was celebrated by a social gathering at the private residence of the British Consul, who kept open house during the afternoon, for all friends and countrymen who favored him with a call. Neither was the day forgotten by Capt Harrison of the R. M. steamer Africa. She was dressed in colors, and at noon fired a salute of thirty-three guns. The same acknowledgement was made by Capt.
