



## NOTICE TO THE PUBLIC.

ON and from MONDAY the 31st instant, there will be a tri-weekly Mail from Halifax through to Canada, by way of Amherst, Saint John, Fredericton, Woodstock, &c.; and also from the Bend of Petitcodiac to Newcastle, Miramichi. A contract, also, is about to be entered into with the owners of the Steamer *Pilot*, for a regular communication between Saint John, Digby, and Annapolis, three times weekly each way, during the months of May, June, July, August, and September; twice weekly, during the months of April, October, and November; and once weekly, during the four winter months of December, January, February, and March—by all which communications Mails will be forwarded to and from Saint John and Halifax.

These changes will involve an entire re-arrangement of the Mail service on the above lines, and the branches in connection therewith; and the following are tables of the days and hours of arrival and departure under the new arrangement, viz:—
