All articles and live Stock intended for competition shall be entered with the Secretary or local agents on or before the 21st of September, and delivered to the Executive Committee on or before Saturday, the 2nd of October, at the risk of the Exhibitor, and without charge to the Society. 2. In addition to the local Committees already named, Agents will hereafter be appointed at Woodstock, Grand Falls, St Andrews, St Stephen, St. George, Campo-bello, Grand Manan, Burton, Canning, Sheffield, Gagetown, Hampton Ferry, St. John, Sussex Vale, Hopewell, Hillsborough, Bend, Shediac, Dorchester, Sackville, Richibucto, Buctouche, Chatham, Newcastle, Bathurst, Dalhousie and Campbelltown, whose duty it shall be to enter all articles for the Exhibition from their respective neighborhoods, and to forward a list of such Entries to the Corresponding Secretary. 3. A sum has been appropriated towards the transmission of articles specially recommended
