Class Licences granted on Certificates of Local Inspectors be issued at any convenient time, inder the direction of the Board, and that all Pupil Teachers who have passed through the Training School, may receive, after favorable report of the Examiners and Certificate of the Training Master, as provided in the Ac', a temporary Licence, pursuant to Sec 11, until, at the periods above specified, they be classed, pursuant to Sec. 9."

II. "That, pursuant to Sec 12, the School Books sanctioned by the Board be those published by direction of the commissioners of National Education in Ireland, with such additions as may, from time to time, be approved by the Board ; and that the following be forthwith approved :--
