Her cellar and pantry, are always supplied wi the needful raw material, which she works up inteates palatable form to fill up vacumens at meal times.

Heavy bread, cold buckwheat cakes, and ranchild. butter are novelties which her gude man and t ord-children have heard tell of by some of the neighbo but have never seen.
