

the beach, and bonfires were lighted for their direction. A sea of unusual violence struck the vessel about three o'clock in the afternoon, and unfortunately carried the second mate overboard—no effort could be made to save him in the roaring boiling billows, and his body has been found among the rocks severely mangled.

The vessel will doubtless become a total wreck, as her bottom appears to be ground out. The masts and rigging, are however, standing all complete. The cargo of deals remains entire in the ship, and will most likely be saved, although she lies in a rough place for securing it.

The schr. Marie, of this port, Driscoll, bound hence to the Bend of Peticodiac, with a cargo of merchandise valued at upwards of £5000, on returning into port in the forenoon, was driven ashore on the rocks to the S. E. of the Barracks in a heavy surf. The persons on board, five in number, whose lives were in imminent peril, were nobly rescued by the life-boat from the steamer Eastern City, under the charge of Capt. Simon Pike, second Pilot of that vessel, and manned by him and Thomas Long, helmsman, and a Mr. Scott, of Calais, Maine.—St. John Courier.
