We confess that we went with high expectations of receiving such a treat as cannot always be looked for in such a small community. The favorable motice we received of the Concert given last week had perhaps some influence in leading us to look for something more than common ; yet, high as our expectations were, they were far exceeded by the perfermance of the evening. We may be partial, and that partiality may have influenced our judgment, but some of the pieces sung on Thursday evening, to our taste at least, surpassed anything we ever heard from the far-famed Harmoneons. It would be invidious and injudicious to single out any individual performer, when all sustained their parts with so much promptness and so much judgment. We can fully endorse all that our correspondent stated last week; and further, that we have seldom witnessed a more striking proof-particularly in the highly desirable acquirement of singing -of the utility of having an instructor fully master of his business, as Mr. Purce has proved himself to be. His arrangements were excellent, and his discipline all that could be desired. The repeated plaudits of an intelligent audience must have been gratifying to the performers, and afford sufficient proof that the talents of Mr. Purce have been fully appreciated by the people of Woodstock.


Deaths.
