NOTICE TO TEACHERS.

THE Inspector of Schools for the County of Carleton deems it advisable to apprise Teachers that the Chief Superintendent has recently issued the following Order, under the direction of the Provincial Board of Education: "That from and after the date of this Circular, the Chief Superintendent shall not place upon his Semi-Annual Schedule the claim of any Teacher to Provincial allowance, unless his or her Return or Register be accompanied by a Certificate from the local Inspector, in addition to the usual one, that the Teacher has submitted to him a memorandum in writing, signed by the Trustees, to the effect that, the terms of Sec. 3 of the Parish School Act having been complied with, they have given their consent to the engagement of the Teacher."

WOODSTOCK, August 15th, 1856. The following form of Certificate is added in order to assist Trustees, who will please remember that the amount secured by the people must be in the same proportion as the Provincial allowance to the Teacher: FORM OF CERTIFICATE.
