CONVICTION AND SENTENCE OF DEATH. - James Kennedy, the party charged with the murder of Wallace, by an assault with an iron bar, has been tried during the week at Windsor, and found guilty of wilful murder. Sentence of death has been passed upon the prisoner. The Jury, upon an inquiry, when the verdict was being taken, on the part of the prisoner's counsel,-R. Haliburton, Esq.,—declined to make any recommendation for mercy. Their deliberations did not extend beyond about an hour. The female indicted as an accomplice was acquitted. The learned Judge as we understand, held out no hope to the wretched man of any probability of commutation of his sentence. During the recess and while the trial was progressing it was made to appear on affidavit that some party had interrogated one of the Jury as to the party had interrogated one of the Jury as to the probability of the issue of trial, which called forth a reply "that he (the Juror) could say nothing about it," or to that effect, and thereupon the prisoner's counsel moved an arrest of judgment.
