A few years since we published the process of Mr. Roberts, whose potatoes were and are of extraordinary quality, and entirely free from disease. Mr. Roberts contends that potatoes dug the season they are grown, are not thoroughly ripened for seed potatoes, and therefore he leaves a portion of his crop in the ground undug, until the following spring, then digs, dries, and replants them. In some soils potatoes may so remain without any apparent injury from frost, while in other localities they may be injured. When not injured the future product is certainly of superior quality, and after the third succession of this kind the seed vessels or potato balls, so long missing from our potato crops, reappear, which certainly is an indication of restored perfection to the tubers.

In our own practice we have escaped rot on under-drained and sub-soiled land. We plant whole potatoes at a depth of six inches, with flat cultivation, and mainly attribute our success to the absence of redundant moisture in the soil. 


