THE Liverpool Mercury, in its summary of Oct.
30th, has the following:—
The journals and letters brought by the over-
land mail, furnish, after all, but a meagre and im-
perfect account of the great event, the capture of
Delhi, which is generally expected, will break the
back of the insurrection.

By evening a breach was effected in the wall of
the magazine enclosures held in by the enemy,
and the place was stormed next morning. In the
evening, one hundred and twenty-five pieces of
cannon were taken from the magazine.

The Palace now well exposed, guns and mortars
opened from the magazine enclosure, and the enemy
driven at all points. Thus the Kish-
ungunge battery, which repulsed the Junno troops,
was abandoned and occupied, and the garrison
taken swelled the total number of captured troops
to two hundred. The battery on the other side of
the river was also abandoned, and at the date of
the last certain and of the last certain and official
news—7 P.M. on the 16th—an attack upon the
magazine had been repulsed, a chain of posts had
been established from the Cabul gate to the mag-
azine, and the enemy, some hours before day, had
been maintaining only a detached and desultory
warfare from the tops of the houses. Many towns-
people had come in and received quarter, which was
of course refused to every Sepoy. All this is
so satisfactory that we may well credit the tale
from depute, that on the 20th the place was en-
tirely in our hands. The joyous aspect of the
city is not only cheering, but it is a relief to the
souls of the people, who have been so long in the
hands of the enemy, and who have seen the
magazine occupied by a marching column of British
troops, and the flag of the King of Delhi
flourishing over the place, and the English
troops had cut off their communications, so that
according to our despatch, the position of the
conquerors is exceedingly critical. If this despatch
is correct, and if, instead of being besieged, the
English have become the besiegers, and are to
push up in Delhi as they have done at Luck-
now, the only advantage of their success will be
the moral prestige which is supposed to attach to
the possession of the residence of the Great Mogul.
