THE SCHOOL BILL.

Be it enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Legis-

lative Council, and Assembly, as follows:—

1. The Governor in Council may appoint a Chief

Superintendent of Schools, who shall perform the

duties of Secretary to the Board, and fix his salary,

not exceeding three hundred pounds per year, be-

sides travelling charges and contingencies of office,

shall be deemed necessary, and his salary shall
