And, since I have been in this country, I have pursued that course, and a neighbor remarked to me, some years ago, "We can't get along without exchanging with one another ' "Our potatoes will run out," and so I thought .---The Tribune had its influence on my mind, and 1 began to think and then to act. I then picked out my finest potatoes and cut them into quarters and put two of those into a hill. Perhaps I would plant five bushels of that description, and in the
