

Figure 1 is a line graph showing the effect of temperature on the rate of reaction. The x-axis is labeled 'TEMPERATURE (°C)' and ranges from 10 to 100 in increments of 10. The y-axis is labeled 'RATE OF REACTION' and ranges from 0 to 10 in increments of 1.
