



#### MORGAN ECLIPSE.

ROM the book entitled "Morgan Horse," a premium essay on the origin, history and characteristics of this remarkable American breed of Horses, written by D. C. Linsley, Esq., of Middlebury Vt., and published in 1857 by C. M. Saxton & Co., New York. The following is from CIUGAR, page 295. "Morgan Eclipse," was foaled in 1848, the property of J. & R. C.Johnson of Bradford, Vt., sired by Morgan Cæsar, Grand Sire Wooodbury, Great Grand sire Justin Morgan, Eclipse was own brother to Morgan Traveller, 15 hands high, and weighed 991 lbs. Color beautiful chesnut. Was sold in 1854 to an Agricultural Society in New Brunswick for over \$2000. His stock have taken several premiums at State Fairs in Vermont. At the Fair at Brattleborough three of his colts took premiums, besides too mares with foals by their sides from him. He was a very fine horse. Pedigree of dam see Traveller." Ou page 300 is found " 'Mergan Traveller'" was foaled

in 1847, the property of J. & R. C. Johnson of Bradford Vt., sired by Morgan Cæsar, Grand Sire Woodbury, Great Grand Sire, Justin Morgan. Dam kpown as Lady Clifton, sired by American Eclipse."
