It is for farmers to urge on the enterprise to its fullest success, until farming shall become the most attractive in which men can engage; until it shall not be measured merely by the ready money which its followers can count; but by the means it furnishes of daily enjoyment of life : the certainty it gives of a permanent and a beautiful self-supporting home and oc-cupation ; the facilities it affords for unfolding and




