ARRIVAL OF THE "NORTH BRITON."

FARTHER POINT, June 10. The North Briton arrived at Farther Point on Sunday night.

Sicilian despatches are still very contradictory. Late despatches assert that everything was going on well for Garibaldi.

Official Neapolitan telegram of the 26th, says: "This morning the insurgents were attacked by our troops, beaten and driven from their strong position at Parco, now occupied by our columns."

"Bands of Garibaldi have been totally defeated, Garibaldi himself is endeavoring so embark. The rebels, accuse each other of treachery."

Turin, 29th.—Official Gazette publishes an Official despatch from Naples announcing the arrival there of an English steamer with the following news: The insurgents have entered Palermo.

Naples, 28th.—Garibaldi having collected all his forces and military material attacked Palermo on the morning of the 26, and made himself master of all the out works and succeeded in entering the town.

Niagara arrived at Halifax last night. News confirmed that Garibaldi had entered Palermo and established head quarters there, after a fierce combat, and bombardment by sea and land.

Paris, 31st. Telegram from Naples confirms Garibaldi's establishment of head quarters at Palermo. Great Eastern, it is expected, will proceed to sea on the day named.
