A BILL FOR THE RELIEF OF REV. ALLEN BARROW.

Whereas, The Rev. Allen Barrow, a Regularly Ordained Minister, has become a resident of this Province, and the Settled Pastor of the Baptist Church in the Town of Woodstock, and Parish of Northampton, in the County of Carleton; and by reason of his not being a British Subject, is precluded from solemnizing Marriage in this Province;

Be it therefore enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Legislative Council and Assembly—That the Rev. Allen Barrow, after having taken the Oath of allegiance to Her Majesty, before the Provincial Secretary, or some other person to be appointed therefore, without fee, by the Governor, solemnize Marriage by Licence or Publication of Banns with the same effect as any Christian Minister authorized by Chapter 105 Title 37 of the Revised Statutes, may do, subject to the provisions of any Laws in force relating to solemnizing marriage. 4 Ins.
