WHEREAS, the establishment of a Company for the purpose of erecting GAS WORKS in the Town of Woodstock, in order to furnish the means of Lighting the said Town in a superior manner, would be an object of public utility.

Be it therefore Enacted, That CHARLES CONNELL,

CHARLES PERLEY, F. R. J. DIBBLE, JAMES R. TUP-

PER, and JAMES SMELLIE, their Associates, Succes-

sors and Assigns, shall be, and they are hereby erected in-

to a body politic and corporate, by the name of the WOODSTOCK GAS COMPANY, and shall have all the general powers and privileges made incident to a Corporation, by Act of Assembly in this Province, for the purpose of Lighting the Town of Woodstock with Gas, and for all necessary works therewith concerned. 2. The Capital Stock of the said Corporation shall be SEVEN THOUSAND POUNDS, current money, of New Bruuswick, and shall be divided into Seven Hundred Shares, of Ten Pounds each, to be paid in at such times, and in such instalments, as the business of the said Company shall require, provided that the said Cap tal Stock, amounting to shall be actually paid in and invested in the business of the said Corporation, in four years from the passing of this Act; And provided also, That the said Corporation shall. when necessary, have leave to extend the said Capital Stock of the said Corporation to the sum of FIFTEEN THOUSAND POUNDS, of like current money, and
