WHEREAS, the establishment of a Company for the purpose of erecting GAS WORKS in the Town of Woodstock, in order to furnish the means of Lighting the said Town in a superior manner, would be an object of public utility.

Be it therefore Enacted, That CHARLES CONNELL,

CHARLES PERLEY, F. R. J. DIBBLE, JAMES R. TUP-PER, and JAMES SMELLIE, their Associates, Successors and Assigns, shall be, and they are hereby erected in . to a body politic and corporate, by the name of the WOODSTOCK GAS COMPANY, and shall have all the general powers and privileges made incident to a Corporation, by Act of Assembly in this Province, for the No connection with St. John Establishment purpose of Lighting the Town of Woodstock with Gas, and for all necessary works therewith concerned.

2.
