

SHOW and FAIR for 1861.

1. None but Members allowed to compete.
2. Any article exhibited must be the property of a Exhibitor.
3. All Grain, Roots, and Manufactures must be the production of this County the present year. All Stock, except breeding animals, must have been raised in this County. Animals, such as Horses, Cattle, Sheep, &c. must have been raised and kept within the County at least six months previous to the Show.
4. Applicants for premiums on Root Crops must exhibit a sample of one bushel on the 1st of December and an average sample of one bushel on the 1st of January. The Secretary a statement of the amount delivered upon the specified quantity of land, sown to by himself and another credible person. Samples of grain must be two bushels.
5. The Secretary is authorized to receive more than one premium on articles of the same kind and character, except:
 - a. Class 1, live stock.
