

lines between Warsaw and St. Petersburg have been injured. Collisions between the troops and insurgents have occurred at Raciaz, Ronsk, Majaki, Tokozon and Labarton. Two thousand rebels were posted at Ostrog, and others at Burgulok and Bealupodotok. A troop of insurgents attacked Tomasz, driving out 500 Cossack frontier posts. Warsaw students accompanied the rebels at Bialka.

St. Petersburg, Jan. 23.—The Journal de St. Petersburg of to-day says that telegraphic communication between Warsaw and St. Petersburg has been re-established.—Troops have been dispatched to the vicinity of the river Bug. The districts of Kuren and Nethynia, bordering on Poland, have been declared in a state of siege. The conscription took no part in the rising. The concentration of troops in all quarters is stifling the rebellion.

Paris, Jan. 23.—The Moniteur of to-day says Lord Cowley has been instructed by Earl Russell to express to Drouin de L'Hopital the satisfaction felt by the British Government on account of the late speech of the Emperor to the French exhibitors, at the World's Fair, and its strong desire to see the sentiment of mutual esteem daily strengthen the ties of friendship which unite the two nations, as well as their governments.

St. Petersburg, Jan. 27.—Revolutionary bands have taken refuge in the forests in several places. The peasants have seized the insurgents at Lublin. They captured 21, among whom is a Catholic priest, and have given them up to the authorities. All the prisoners have been tried by court martial. The conscription has been carried out at Bork without resistance. Warsaw is tranquil.

The Post says the Prince of Leiningen is the real candidate. He is a grandson of the late Duchess of Kent.

London, Jan. 28.—The Bank of England to-day, in anticipation of the regular Court of Directors, advanced its minimum rate of discount from 4 to 5 per cent. This movement caused a depression in the Liverpool cotton and other markets.
