

Canterbury, Harvey, Shediac, Hillsboro, Sheffield, Caraquet, are authorised to issue and pay Money Orders (under the direction of the Postmaster General,) or any sum not exceeding in any one order \$100. 2nd .- When Money Orders exceeding \$100 in aggregate amount, are issued in on day and to the same person, by one or more Offices upon another Office, the Postmaster of the Office drawn upon (if necessary,) may delay the payment of such Orders for six days. 3rd .- All Money Orders shall be drawn upon Printed Forms supplied by the Post Office Department; and no Order will be valid or payable unless given upon the regular Printed Form.
