

I boarded the junk along with the chief officer of the Waratah and another gentleman .-Upon entering the cabin we saw Captain Millan lying with his head half cut off, his belly ripped open, and several of his fingers cut off. In one of his hands he held a sword half drawn. The body of his wife was standing naked against the bed, with spear wounds all over her body, and one side of her A head beat in. Their infant child, with its brains dashed out, was lying on the bed. Upon opening the books, we found that he had been plundered of 11.000 taels. The deed was done by his own men, assisted by mandaria soldiers. He was taken by surprise at midnight when they were all asleep .-The woman we found on board escaped, as she slept in another room. We took the junk in tow. and handed her over to the British Consul at Silver Island, Chin-Kiang."
