HOUSE OF ASSEMBLY

THE following was adopted as one of the Standing Rules of the House in the Session of 1862:

"26th.—That no Bill of a private nature shall be received by the House after the fourteenth day from the meeting of the Session, both inclusive; and that the Clerk of this House, do, one month previous to the meeting of the Legislature, cause fifty copies of this rule to be sent to each of the Clerks of the Peace in the several Counties, for distribution, and cause the same to be inserted in the Royal Gazette, and two Newspapers in such County where Newspapers are published."
