American News.

BANKRUPT, Feb. 27. News received of severe reverses to Seymour's expedition in Florida; Seymour met enemy 15,000 strong 50 miles beyond Jacksonville. Three hours' battle ensued, and Federal forces were overpowered by numbers and compelled to fall back, losing from 500 to 1,000, and 5 pieces of artillery.

Reported that Farragut was to engage Fort Gaines, Mobile.

Forty-five Confederate Ringleaders met at Fort Morgan, and were under sentence. Their execution would injure Confederates in Mobile.

Federal advance to Dalton a reconnaissance, discovering Johnson in large force. Federals fell back to Tunnel Hill. Longstreet reported falling back to Atlanta; his force reported destitute of shoes and clothing.

BANKRUPT, Feb. 20. Further particulars of Federal disaster in Florida says Seymour advanced carelessly and was entrapped by superior force.

Reported force was sent from Charleston, and that Deane, regard commanded.

Federal loss from twelve to fifteen hundred. The van suffered severely from sharpshooters. Seymour placed under arrest.

Last accounts say that Longstreet was still retreating and Schofield pursuing, but no engagement expected south of Virginia line. Despatches say that Longstreet was retreating to Richmond. President's amnesty proclamation extensively circulated.

New reported Chattanooga army not fallen back, but will soon attack Dalton.

Times despatch confirms movement of the army of the Potomac. Demonstration a bold one and will be supported by a powerful force.

New Orleans letter to the World reports Juarez reached Tamaulipas preparing to give up all country to the French.

Confederate despatches report heavy fighting on 21st at Pontotoc, Miss., killing 400 and capturing 100 Federals. Col. Forrest killed. Co. Barksdale and McCulloch badly wounded.

Federal Cavalry charge was repulsed.

Also that Longstreet had withdrawn his forces to point not prudent to mention.

Federals disappeared from front, retreating towards Chattanooga, pursued by Gen. Wheeler's cavalry.

Federals continue shelling Charleston.—140 shells were fired on 24th.

Louisville despatch says Federal forces reached Morris-town.

Reported that Longstreet's forces were going East at double quick on 24th.

Schooner Louisa, of Nassau, was captured near Brazos River with a cargo of gunpowder, Enfield rifles, &c.

LATER. Washington despatch gives latest information from Potomac army to 30th January morning. No battle occurred but some skirmishing on Sunday. Evident Lee don't intend to leave intrenchments to fight, unless compelled by Meade. Skirmishing was expected. Details of battle in Florida published. Federal force engaged at Oulster, 4,500 infantry, 400 cavalry, 20 pieces of artillery. Enemy reported 15,000, very strongly posted. Federal troops fought nobly, retreating in good order, and in the end, in the face of the enemy. Gov. Gardner of Port Hudson commanding Confederates. Reported arrest of Gen. Seymour probably untrue. The morale of Federals unimpaired. Legat's cavalry, it is reported, join Sherman at Selma.

Special dispatches report Gen. Thomas reinforced quite largely and advanced from Tunnel Hill to Dalton.

Gen. Smith, of cavalry expedition, arrived at Cairo. It was 7,000 strong. Its object was to clear the country of straggling Confederate forces, and to divert in favor of Sherman and join him if possible. Grierson's column burnt about 3,000 bales of Confederate cotton and brought off 10,000 mules. Loss during expedition 150. House passed Bill establishing Freedmen's Bureau. President approved Bill reviving grade of Lieutenant General, and sent grants of nomination for that position. The notorious guerrilla, Richardson, was captured on Sunday. Feb. 16th.

BANKRUPT, March 3. Federals making general advance into Georgia; strong apprehensions of Sherman's army—considerable skirmishing &c. on Rapidan, result not known.

The decision of the police magistrate of St. John to surrender the Chesapeake pirates to the United States authorities, under the Extradition treaty, looks very well upon its face; but we are inclined to suspect that the real object was to embarrass our government on the question of the deposition of the criminals. We are all agreed that these fellows are pirates and murderers and deserve hanging, but unfortunately they claim to be acting under a privateer's commission from the rebel government, and if the latter should threaten reprisal upon the unfortunate Union prisoners in their charge the case would be awkward. The blue-roses would have served us a good turn had they hung the pirates on their own account.

Arrival of the Canada.

HALIFAX, March 3, 1864.

Canada from Liverpool 20th arrived at Halifax 4 o'clock this morning. Privateer Georgia quietly slipped away from Chertseyburg, midnight 15th and sailed out to sea. Removed in London 10th, that France contemplated speedy recognition of Confederates. Confederate Loan advanced from 57 to 59 in consequence.

In Parliament Marquis Clarendon gave notice that he would, on 23rd, call attention to negotiations by Federals in Mexico, and ask what steps Government would take respecting it.

In Commons it was asked the Attorney General whether when English vessel was captured by American cruiser in neutral harbor it was duty of Government to wait for decision of prize court before demanding reparations, also whether capture of British vessel Scutiger at Matamoros was not violation of International Law. Attorney General said it would not be duty of Government to wait for action of Prize Court in such case, but with regard to the seizure it was disputed whether she was captured in Mexican waters or not. Instructions to American Cruisers was distinct and clear that no such vessel should be taken in Mexican waters and he said no doubt United States would make reparations in case their cruisers captured British vessels in Mexican waters.

In Commons, 19th, Laird said Government had no official information of capture of British vessel Marian by Alabama; also said no communication had been addressed to Government with view of recognition of Mexican Empire. British Government had declined to express opinion on subject. In reply to Palmerston said to capture of Chesapeake in harbor of San Pedro, N. S., by Federal vessel, Laird said Lyons had been instructed to demand redress, but before Lyons instructions were received had expressed regret and offered reparations. In reply to some question on Danish trouble, Palmerston spoke strongly as to Austro-Prussian invasion of Schleswig, and was loudly cheered; he declined saying what Government would do if Germany entered Jutland.
