A Bill to facilitate the construction of a Branch Railway to Woodstock in the County of Carlton.

Be it enacted, &c., &c.

1. The Municipality of the County of Carlton is hereby authorized to contract a loan on the credit of the County for an amount not exceeding Forty thousand Dollars, for the purpose of aiding by loan or otherwise in the construction of a Branch Line of Railway from the line of the Saint Andrews and Quebec Railway to the River Saint John in the said County.

2. The said Municipality are hereby authorized to loan to any Company who may agree to construct the said Branch Line of Railway a sum not exceeding \$40,000, to be secured by mortgage or otherwise, or on the property real or personal thereof, as the Council of said Municipality may by By-Law to be made by them for that purpose may direct.

3. The said Municipality may donate to any Company who shall build a Branch Line of Railway from the line of the Saint Andrews and Quebec Railway to the River Saint John in the said County a sum not exceeding \$50,000.

4. Certificate of Debt to be called Debentures, payable in current money of this Province, to be numbered consecutively commencing with No. 1, with coupons annexed bearing interest at six per cent, payable semi-annually, at such places as shall be specified hereinafter, may be issued from time to time as the Railway proceeds, in such form, verified and attested in such manner, payable at such places, in such amounts, and on such conditions as the Municipality may prescribe; the principal of such Debentures shall be paid in full at a period not exceeding twenty years, to the holder thereof.

5. The several amounts that shall be issued under the requirements of this Act shall not exceed the sum of \$40,000.

6. In case the said Council of said Municipality shall borrow any money under any of the provisions of this Act, they are authorized and required to form a Sinking Fund of \$150 per centum on the amount issued, in aid of the redemption of the Debentures issued under the provisions of this Act, and to cause the same to be invested in Provincial Debentures, together with all interest arising from said Fund.

7. All sums of money authorized to be raised, borrowed or loaned under any of the provisions of this Act shall be assessed, levied, and collected in the same manner in all respects as the County and Parish rates, and shall be paid to such parties and in such way, and to such uses for the said Act, and the object of this Act, as the Council of said Municipality may direct by any By-Law.

8. All Debentures issued under the provisions of this Act to be signed by the Warden of the Municipality, also countersigned by the Secretary Treasurer of the Municipality. The Government in Council is hereby authorized and required to give effect to the provisions of this Act, so far as relates to the issue of Debentures. The number, date and amount of all Debentures issued under this Act to be entered on the minutes of the Municipality, also recorded in a Book to be kept for that purpose by the Registrar of Deeds and Wills for the County of Carlton.

At a meeting of the Directors of the Woodstock Branch Railway, held at the office of L. P. Fisher, Esq., on the 7th July inst., the following Resolution was unanimously passed—

"That the Municipality of the County of Carlton be requested to grant to the Company a loan of Debentures, amounting to \$40,000, under the recent Act of Assembly, upon such terms and conditions as they may think advisable for the interest of the County."

Extract from the Minutes.

Whereas, in the opinion of this Council it is deemed expedient, in order to secure to the Woodstock branch railway Company, the subsidy of \$10,000 per mile, procured by the fact that the said Company, in order to secure the construction of said Woodstock branch, to give effect to the second section of a bill to facilitate the construction of a branch railway to Woodstock, in the County of Carlton; therefore Resolved, that this Municipality issue its credit to the Woodstock Branch Railway Company to the amount of \$40,000, the said amount and interest to be secured to the said Municipality, by a first mortgage on the property, real and personal, of said Company, and to be given in the form of debentures. Provided that no such debentures shall be issued until the right of way of the whole distance, from the St. Andrew's railway to the Iron Works, at Upper Woodstock, is obtained, and at least one-half of said road is completely graded, at which time such debentures, to the amount of \$20,000, shall be issued and placed in the hands of said Woodstock Branch Railway Company, such amount and interest to be secured by a first mortgage as aforesaid; and upon the completion of the grading of such branch road, the further sum of \$20,000, or the remaining half of the whole loan of \$40,000, shall be issued in debentures, and placed in the hands of the said Company, upon a like security as aforesaid, for the principal and interest.

And further resolved, that the foregoing shall not go into effect, and no action be taken thereunder, until it is approved of by a majority of the ratemakers in this County, in the way and manner hereafter provided.

A public meeting of the ratemakers of each Parish, shall be held at the places at which the polls for election of Representatives to the Legislature are usually held, as follows:

At such public meeting, there shall be a presiding officer, and poll clerk, to be appointed by this Council, for each Parish.

The votes shall be taken by open vote, and the names of all voters shall be entered upon poll books, to be properly prepared for the purpose, by the poll clerk, with columns headed respectively for and against. The assessor's lists for 1865 shall be used as the check list, of persons entitled to vote, and no assessment for any parish has been made for 1865, the assessment list for 1864 shall be used; and only such persons whose names appear on the said lists, qualified to vote for Councilors for 1864, shall be eligible to vote at said meeting. The polls shall be opened at 9 o'clock, a.m., and continue open until 4 o'clock, p.m., at which hour it shall be declared closed by the presiding officer, when the clerk shall count the votes, and the presiding officer, shall then and there declare the result. The poll books shall be sealed up immediately after the declaration, and forwarded by the presiding officer without delay to the Warden of the County.

Should it appear when the poll books are all in, that a majority of the votes in the County has been thrown in favor of the proposition to grant the credit of the County, as in the foregoing resolution provided, the Warden of the County shall, and is hereby authorized to call at an early day thereafter, a special meeting of the Council, in order to give effect to the same.
