This change has been made in consequence of the difficulty which has been experienced in deciding what is, and what is not, a pattern or sample of merchandise of intrins c value. 2nd. Samples of seeds, drugs, and similar articles intended for delivery within the United Kingdom, are now allowed to be sent in bags entirely closed, provided such bags be transparent, so that the Officers of the Post Office may be able to satisfy themselves as to the nature of the contents. 3rd. The rule which prohibited the transmission

through the Post, as patterns of articles of cutlery, has been rescinded; and scissors, knives, razors, ples, provided they be packed and guarded in so se.
