Washington, July 6.

Major General Hancock repaired to the Arsenal at noon to-day and delivered the death warrants of Payne, Harrold, Mrs. Surratt and Atzorot to Major General Hartsuff who is in charge of the prisoners, when they together visited the condemned to inform them of the sentence. Payne was the first to whom intelligence was communicated; it did not seem to take him by surprise, as doubtless he anticipated no other sentence, and nerved himself accordingly. The other prisoners were more or less affected; Mrs. Suratt, particularly, sank under the dread announcement, and pleaded for four days additional time to prepare berself for death.
All the prisoners will be attended by a clergyman of their own designation. The scaffold has been erected in the south yard of the old penitentiary building, which is enclosed by a high brick wall; coffins and burial clothes have already been prepared; only a limited number of persons will be admitted to the scene. The sentences of the other prisoners will be carried into immediate effect. Gold 1394.


