"The Bill provides that no person is to be arrested by the writ of capias except in certain cases of damages assessed by a jury, such as may be given in actions for libel, slander, assault, battery, seduction, breach of promise of marriage, malicious arrest, trespass, prosecution, injury, or malicious filing of a petition in bankruptcy. A broad distinction is, therefore, raised at once between the penalties following an action in tort, and an action on contract. There is no longer to be a commercial penalty following debt, and creditors are in future not so much to trust the man as the trader upon whose assets and means of payment they must exercise their judgment before giving eredit. It is right to abolish the penalties now incident to contract, but it would not be right to say that no debtor should be imprisoned in certain cases, and the line of distinction is easily drawn at the point of fraud. Where a judgment exists for a sum of £20 or upwards. and where the Judge who tried the case certifies that there was fraud in the inception of the debt, or that the debt is founded on breach of trust, or that credit was obtained by means of some false pretence, or that the plaintiff has, been put to expenses and delays by vexatious defence of the action, arrest may follow.
