so employ. The Boston Journal says:—
"Instead of drawing on the General Government for muskets, of which it has an abundant supply of a quality good enough for all ordinary militia purposes, Maryland has reduced the value of its quota into artillery and made its requisi tion for that arm alone. It orders new Spring field muskets, together with equipments, at a cost of twenty-three dollars per man. The union forms already ordered amount to over \$188,000 00 and the arms swell the expense to above \$230,-000-and this in a State burdened with a debt of nearly four millions of dollars, and having hard work before it to escape bankruptey. "The total of the organized militia is about

ten thousand; four thousand siz hundred being in Baltimore alone. The artillery companies are almost entirely composed of returned rebel soldiers. The Commissary General, whose saddle-cloth was got up at an expense of eighty dollars, was the former editor of a paper which was suppressed for treasonable and seditious lan-guage during the war. It would seem that a body thus composed and officered is capable at least of as much injury as good."
