empowers us to donate to any company who the Carleton Sentinel. shall build, &c. Have they built the road, or have they offered us any security that it will be completed? They have done neither the one nor the other, and therefore are not in such a position before us as to authorize us under the law to make a donation. How different is the position of the County and Town. We are asked the supresse court for an injunction.

I'd like to have the road built. but not under the next annual meeting. such circumstances as surround this matter now.

If the Directors were to approach us like men of you'll build me a mill I'll grind for you for a company: they come to us and say, " build this present. road for us-we can't." But would they carry us free over it when built-oh no! There are too many loafers around Woodstock to monopolise all the perquisites. All the company say to us is, " give us a donation and we'll finish the road." I have said the comrany offers us no proof that the road will be completed; further I say they cannot give good security as the law provides. Sec. 10, cap. 3, 27 Vic, reads:-

"10. That for the purpose of securing the due and efficient completion of all or any of the said Lines of Railway, or Branches and Extensions in the first Section of this Act mentioned, any moneys advanced or paid to any Company or Body Corporate under the provisions of this Act, shall attach and stand, and are hereby declared to be a primary mortgage or first charge in favour of the Queen, for the benefit of this Province, upon this Line or Lines of Railway, and the Branches and Extensions undertaken to be built by such Company or Body Corporate, and upon the stations, station houses, rolling stock, and property of every description, and shall attach immediately upon the advance or payment of any portion of the said aid, upon all property owned by such Company or Body Corporate; and in order to fix and ascertain the amounts from time to time advanced or paid to such Company or Body Corporate, the President and Treasurer of the same shall deliver to the Provincial Treasurer a certificate under their hands, stating the amount so received; which certificate shall be sufficient evidence of such primary mortgage or first charge under this Act; provided always, that on the completion of the Road according to the terms of the agreement, such mortgage or first charge shall

So that the road stands already mortgaged to the Government as a guarantee for its completion. Then again, what guarantee have we that the company is not in debt, and that if we donate anything the amount will not be taken to pay the debt, leaving the road as it is. Mr. Dibblee has said that if we give \$20,000, Woodstock would have to bear one third of the tax. But that is not so, the law passed through polishing hands and Woodstock is exempted. I read 29 Vic., cap. 17, sec. 9:

49. Notwithstanding the provisions of an Act made and passed in the twenty eight year of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled An Act to jacilitate the construction of a Branch Railway to Woodstock, the County Council of the County of Carleton shall have no power to levy, assess or collect any sum or sums of money for the purpose of aiding in any way in the construction of the said Railway, upon the inhabitants of the said Town of Woodstock, for and in respect of any property what ever within the limits of the said Town of Woodstock, so that the Town of Woodstock shall be exempted for taxation under the said Act, or any other Act to enable the said Municipality to aid in constructing the said rail-

And the 10th section further exempts the Town from any liability beyond the amount of the stock subscribed thereby, even though the road should not pay running expenses. The

"10. The Town of Woodstock shall not liable, nor shall the property thereof, nor the inhabitants of the said Town, be liable in any way by reason of taking stock in the said Woodstock Railway Company, beyond the payment of any stock authorized to be taken by this

Now while it will not be disputed that, of the taxation which is involved, Woodstock is exempt, there are those who still say, as they have said, endeavouring to mislead the people, the tax will fall light on the County, for Woodstock will have to bear one third. The press too has put forward the same erroneous idea, whether intentional or not. (Here Mr. Irvine quoted from the SENTINEL of the 9th February, in which it was stated, in other words, that if the County donated \$20,000 in bonds, redeemable in twenty years, the tax, to pay the interest and form a sinking fund for the redemption of the bonds, would be, per capita, on a population of 30,000 souls, 6 cents.) Here, Mr. Irvine said, the whole population is included, that of Woodstock which should not have been, as well as the rest of the County. 
