## Latest by Cable.

LONDON, 30th .- The French troops now occupy Civita Vicche; more are embarking at Toulon for Italy. Regarding the report that the Italian army had crossed the Roman frontier, it is reported that the Pope has informed the French Government that if King Victor Emmanuel enters Rome, he, the Pope, will Gen. Garibaldi has been ordered by leave. the commander of the Italian forces to disarm and disperse his forces. A new Italian Cabinet has been formed with Gen. Menabrea at the head. Owing to the serious aspect of politieal affairs a national diet will be called together at an early day. The news from Rome is Telegraphic communication from exciting. Rome to Florence is broken, the insurgents having cut the wires. The latest despatches received fr m Rome before the destruction of telegraphic communication was highly important; the insurgents in the city were actively engaged and an outbreak was momentarily expected; the victorious army of Garibaldi was only six miles away, organizing for an attack on the city. Orsine shells were being fired in the streets by the party of action, who seemed to be impatiently awaiting the arrival of Gari-Auldi. The precautions of the authorities for the preservation of peace were apparently ineffectual.

LIVERPOOL is now the centre of Fenian pantic reports. Mysterious proceeding among the Irish inhabitants have caused the authorities to take extraordinary precautions. The annories of the volunteers and the gun-shops in the city are guarded, and the police patrols have been doubled, Digby Seymour, Esq., principal counsel for the defence has made another aplication for the removal to London of the Fenian trials just commenced at Manchester, on the ground of bostility of public feeling against the accused in the latter city, but the Government has refused to grant the request.
