The doors will be closed at half-past 11, a. m., and the Judges will enter upon their duties. After they have finished the doors will again be opened, and remain open until

13.—The decisions of the Judges will be final as to the respective merits of the articles. They will be 1.00 at liberty to withhold any Premium in any department, if they consider that no animal or article in the department is of sufficient merit.

14.—Special Premiums will be awarded upon any article not in the List, if such are offered, as the Judges consider worthy of encouragement.

15.—Tickets will be issued to intending Exhibitors at the President's effice in Woodstock, on Monday Tuesday & Wednesday, the 12th 13th and 14th of October, up to 7 o'clock p. m. after which no more tickets will be issued, any person wishing to get tickets before that time can have them by call-
